Instructions

1. **Complete and Submit the “Membership Application Form” found on Page 5 of this package**

The application can be delivered in person to Nanaimo Yacht Club, by email to nyc@nanaimoyc.ca or by regular mail.

2. Be sure to complete as many sections on the Membership Application Form;
 - a. Type of Membership you are applying for.
 - b. Your choice of payment options.
 - c. The application should be sponsored by a NYC Club Member when possible.
 - d. How did you hear about us?
 - e. Your reasons for wishing to join the Nanaimo Yacht Club.
 - f. Personal Information Section.
 - g. Current Interests and Boating Interests.
3. If you are under 40 years of age NYC offers a discount for Regular Membership, based on the age. Proof of Age (e.g. photocopy of driver's license, passport or birth certificate) must be supplied at the time of the orientation. The Regular Membership fee is determined by the age of the primary member.
4. When the membership application is received by the NYC Office, the information is then passed to the Membership Committee. They will contact the applicant with the next available orientation date. The orientation is conducted in person at the Yacht Club.
5. Payment for membership must be submitted when attending the orientation. (Refundable only prior to approval of your application by the Club Executive; refund request must be in writing)
6. After the application has been approved by the Membership Committee it is;
 - a. Forwarded to the Club Executive for review.
 - b. Posted in the monthly club newsletter (personal information is removed).
 - c. Read out at the next General Meeting.
 - d. Voted on for approval at the next Executive meeting. If approved this would be the official date for the start of membership.

7. New members are then invited to the next monthly General Meeting to be introduced to the membership and to receive their membership package.

Membership Categories Payments & Dues

A Member is a person who has attained the full age of 19 years, who resides in an area defined as Vancouver Island, and the Gulf Islands in British Columbia, who followed the prescribed procedure, paid the prescribed fees and has been accepted for membership by the Executive Committee.

Membership Fees are based on the fee structure set yearly on October 1 and are subject to change without notice.

- **REGULAR MEMBER** - a member who has paid the prescribed fees as listed in the Rules & Regulations Fee Schedule and has been accepted as a member by the Executive Committee. A regular member does not hold permanent moorage.

- **MOORING MEMBER** - a member who has paid the prescribed fees as listed in the Rules & Regulations Fee Schedule. Before a Regular member can become a Mooring Member, the Regular Membership fee must be paid in full. A Regular Member can only become a Mooring Member when they have been given moorage.

Mooring Member \$2,500.00 plus GST Moorage: \$3.37 outside, \$5.76 Sheds /ft/month plus GST

- **JUNIOR MEMBER** - a person from age eight years to eighteen years inclusive who has paid the prescribed fee, followed the prescribed procedure of sponsorship and responsibility and has been accepted by the Executive Committee. A Junior member shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club but shall not vote or hold office, and shall have no interest in any property of the Club. Upon reaching the age of nineteen years a Junior member may become

a regular member if the prescribed conditions are met. A Junior member shall not earn moorage seniority.

Junior Member (Parents are members of NYC)	\$ 25.00 plus GST
Junior Member (Parents are not members of NYC)	\$ 50.00 plus GST

- **ASSOCIATE MEMBER** – a person who has attained the full age of 19 years, who has followed the prescribed procedure and has been accepted by the Executive Committee. An Associate member shall not vote, hold office, chair any committee, have moorage, or acquire seniority with respect to moorage, and shall have no interest in any property of the Club. They shall be entitled to attend all General Meetings and enjoy all facilities and functions at the Club, with the exception of Reciprocal clubs and outstations. If an Associate Member decides to become a Regular Member their fee already paid will be credited towards the Regular Membership Fee.

Club Committees

It is expected that members contribute to the Club's social, recreational and entertainment activities and use of the clubhouse. The following is a list of Club committees and activities.

Please check your interest:

- **Clubhouse Committee** - all construction and maintenance of the Club properties above the high-water mark, such as the Clubhouse, are done by this committee.
- **Event Planning** - coordinates and orchestrates all social events of the Club e.g. the Commodore's Ball, New Year's Eve party, Sail Past etc.
- **Bar Committee** - operates the bar in accordance with the Club's licence.
- **Trophy Committee** - maintains the Club trophies, and the record of their donors, recipients, and locations.
- **Planning Committee** - investigates members' interest for long range planning, and projects the costs thereof.
- **Membership Committee** - responsible for processing new membership applications, the orientation of new members.
- **Harbour and Moorage Committee** - all maintenance of Club property below the highwater mark, such as docks, sheds, pilings etc. is handled by this committee.
- **Safety Committee** - performs annual safety inspections, and enforces the Club safety rules and regulations.
- **Moorage Allocation Committee** - works with the Rear Commodore in allocation of moorage, and any circumstances not clearly covered by the rules and regulations.
- **Emergency Committee** - keeps the Club prepared for dealing with emergencies which may threaten the property, such as winter storms.
- **Electrical Committee** - repairs and maintains the electrical service of the Club property, including the docks.
- **Racing Committee** - organizes all racing series of the Club.
- **Cruising Committee** - Helps organize all cruising events of the Club.
- **Snake Island Regatta (SIN) Committee** - organizes the SIN regatta, and coordinates any sub-committees involved in putting on this event.
- **Publicity Committee** - publicizes the Club and its events.
- **Yearbook Committee** - Helps produces the annual Yearbook.
- **Heritage Committee** - Helps records and processes the Club history, and maintain the Club archives.
- **NYC Online Committee** - Helps support the Club's Website and Facebook.

*PLEASE READ AND SIGN THIS APPLICATION

- (a) A payment option is available for Regular membership for the initial entrance fee. The applicant must pay 25% initially and will be billed at the next three regular billing times for a third portion of the remainder plus 10% for administration fee. Full payment can be made at any time. Annual dues and other fees are payable as per Fee Schedule. All regular membership privileges including seniority will apply from date of joining; except no moorage shall be allocated until entrance fee is paid in full.

Upon attaining permanent moorage \$2,500.00 + \$125 GST = \$2,625.00

FROM RULES AND REGULATIONS

B. Moorage - Allocation:

- 1 (a) All moorage space shall remain the property of the Club.
7 (e) No boat used for any purpose other than as a pleasure craft may be moored or stored at the Club with the exception of Emergency Vessels approved by the Rear Commodore.
9 Living aboard - No person shall reside upon any vessel moored at the Club.

D. CLUBHOUSE

1 General Regulations

(d) The use of the Club parking lot is prohibited for parking while commuting directly to and from a member's permanent place of residence, unless special approval is granted by the Executive Committee.

K. ARREARS

- 2** Any member shall cease to be a member of the Club pursuant to By-Law 7(d) if they fail to pay any amount owed by him to the Club for forty-five (45) days after it became payable.
