



## **NYC SILVA BAY OUTSTATION Outstation Etiquette**

This document is intended to raise awareness of issues which might arise with the use of our shared outstation moorage. When you sign the Registration document on the Outstation dock, it indicates you've read the Outstation Rules and Regs. Please read them.

There will be situations where a member has a moorage reservation and arrives to find the dock occupied. Members with reserved dockside moorage should expect that moorage when they arrive, or as soon as possible after arrival. If you are tied to the dock and someone else has it reserved on the Outstation Calendar, you should voluntarily offer to move your boat. Do not make the person with the reservation have to ask you to move.

Stays at the Outstation Dock are limited to two days. Period. After two days find another moorage. Let other members have a chance to use the Outstation.

When mooring, always consider the member coming in after you. Don't block moorage spots others might use. Position your boat so members get maximum use of this facility.

Never tie up dinghies, or other small craft alongside a vessel on the dock, in such a manner as to prevent another boat from rafting.

When rafting, ask permission or announce your intentions to the skipper/passengers of the vessel you are approaching. If no one is aboard, at your earliest convenience, introduce yourself and ask the dockside vessel crew where they would like you to cross their boat.

Respect your neighbours' privacy and their right to peace and quiet. Sound does not travel far when your boat is moored or rafted.

It is important that all members use this facility with the knowledge that the Rules are for everyone's benefit.

Common courtesy goes a long way. You might meet a new friend.
