Thank you Peter and Debra for your countless hours (and years) of work putting the Logline together.



Tolly's Last Cruise

On May 11, two Park Rangers installed a commemorative Bench overlooking CHATTERBOX FALLS in Princess Louisa Inlet. The bench is in memory of Robert Merland 'TOLLY' Tollefson, who first visited there in 1938 on a 23 foot wooden cruiser. TOLLY cruised to Louisa More than 50 times before he retired from boating at age 90.

On May 21, 15 Tollycraft Yachts entered the Inlet through Malibu Rapids including Doug Bell's BELL E LAFF from NYC. Two days later a brief ceremony was held on the dock. Jay Hartland from Anacortes gave the eulogy and noted that TOLLY built about

6000 boats and, with an average of five owners each, TOLLY touched upwards of 30000 boaters. The group of 37 boaters gathered around the bench overlooking the falls while Scott Fultz, a former Tollycraft employee and friend of Tolly for 50 years, spread some of Tolly's ashes from a dinghy into the waters at the base of CHATTERBOX FALLS.

THE Canadian TOLLYCRUISERS sponsored a steak BBQ on the dock followed by a roaring fire in the Pavilion where stories of Tolly were shared. TOLLY has made his final trip to Louisa but his spirit will live on in the mist of Chatterbox Falls for eternity.



To all members of Nanaimo Yacht Club

The Council of BC Yacht Clubs has been closely following the proposal for the development of Squirrel Cove into a marina with numerous mooring buoys. In the same submission there is also an application by the Klahoose First Nation to activate an aquaculture area right in the middle of the passage between the outer and inner coves. Many boaters have reservations as to how all of this will affect a traditional anchorage and safe haven which has been a favorite of many of us over the years. The Council has now set up a website which gives full information about the current proposal for the development of Squirrel Cove, and a number of comments regarding the proposal. It also gives contact information for the authorities who have to approve, or turn down, all or part of the application.

Please have a look at the site as individuals and, if you wish to send comments to the authorities, please go ahead and do so. In addition, please pass the information regarding the website to anyone you think might be interested. We are trying to spread the information as widely as possible. If boaters do not make their views known to the authorities, the proposal may well go through "as is". Please note that the deadline for comment is May 30.
