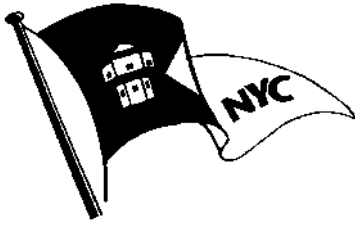

Click on that tab, fill in the required fields, and you've made your reservation! If you find you need to cancel, with your original reservation, you will have been sent an email. That email will contain a link that will allow you to cancel your reservation. This will allow others to use the space, and the site can be accessed as long as you have wifi or Smartphone access.

Also on the Outstation menu you'll find a 'Rules and Regulations' document, as well as some points on 'Outstation Etiquette' that everyone should read and consider. This facility is ours to use year round, I hope it is well utilized.

Sail Training has come to an end for the season, the dinghy docks have returned to their winter moorage spot. Our focus now is to plan for the future; exactly how the Sail Training/Dinghy Racing/Junior program should progress. We'd like to keep up the momentum we've had in the past year and I know the executive supports the continued development of these combined programs.

Moorage: It has been a very busy month for sub-leases, lateral moves and permanent moorage taking place. At this time we are filling 30 ft. spots with members that have joined in 2013 – and at this time we are down to 4 people waiting for 30 ft. moorage spots.

Soot: As all our moored members are aware we had a major problem in late September with soot all over our vessels. Cause of problem – I received a report from the Ministry of Environment confirming that the problem stemmed from a malfunction & fire that occurred at Harmac. I would like to thank all the members' suggestions of the cause that I received after my mass e-mail – some of the suggestions were quite entertaining.

Safety: Vessel Safety Inspections are going well although at this time we still have 190 vessels that need inspecting with 2 days to go. Thanks to all that have signed the new revised Moorage Agreement it was encouraging to know that many of you had read the changes in the Logline.

Conclusion: Thank you to all NYC members for your continued support. I would like to welcome Mel Petreman, Mike Ganderton & Mike Reeves our new members on the Bridge and I look forward to the following year as your Vice Commodore.

Fleet Captain's Report—Continued

One discussion I'm going to start is the one about the otters on the docks. A straw vote at the last Executive meeting showed pretty much unanimous support for some kind of strategy to deal with these pests. I'm about to take on responsibility for the Moorage Committee, and I've been approached regarding a suggested plan to have these animals trapped and removed. To my understanding, there is a legal trapping period during which we could invite trappers onto our facility to do the job. I view these creatures (as natural and wonderful as they are in their own right) as pests, like squirrels in your attic or skunks in your crawlspace. They are creating issues of sanitation, safety, esthetics and damage to member and club property with their presence. If members opposed to such a plan, I'd like to

hear all sides. That place would be at a moorage committee meeting, which will be announced so that all who want to comment will have the opportunity to do so. Details of a meeting will be forthcoming.

The Moorage Committee will make its recommendation to the Executive on how they think we should proceed. The Executive will consider that recommendation.

We joined the 200 dinghy sailors at the Pumpkin Bowl Regatta Oct 18 & 19 at the West Van Yacht Club and clearly showed tenacity and grit in the 28 boat fleet and big breezes. Congratulations to Ben Daniel and Abby Brown (Silver), Jonathan Kelly and Max Therrien (Bronze) and Tiernan Kingzett and Ben Whiting (6th place).

The fall dinghy racing season is wrapping up but not before a few hardy sailors take in one more training event in Victoria with a national team coach over the Remembrance Day weekend. The NYC coaching staff has been working collaboratively with other regional coaches to share resources and knowledge and to make sure our local athletes get every possible opportunity to reach their potential.
