

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## Rear Commodore's Report

Greetings fellow Club members;

I hope you all had as great a summer as Shelley and I did. The Club was very busy over the summer with SIN and GIN, Sail Training and huge numbers of visiting boaters.

In spite of all the activity, our staff came through in usual stellar fashion and there were few issues of any significance to report. I did hear of some downriggers that were stolen, and those thefts are being investigated. A reminder to all in our marina to maintain vigilance in the security of their property and observation/reporting of any suspicious activity.

Shelley and I were the Cruise Leaders for the Symphony Splash Cruise to Victoria Harbour over the past August long weekend. We had eight NYC boats attend, 7 tied up on the Causeway Docks and one at Work Point. The weather was great, we shared appies and a potluck dinner and a few of us did a kayak paddle up the Gorge Inlet. The Symphony performance itself was a treat, many of our group entertained family and friends for the event. It was a very unique get together. We'll need someone to volunteer as Event Leader for next year, if we want this to continue. If you're planning a trip south next year, think about leading the Cruise. It's not difficult, it just needs a planner. Give me a shout, I'll help.

NYC member Chris Monson did a presentation to the Executive at our August meeting, trying to advance our Club's ability to support Kayakers/Paddlers with storage options. We will be reviewing these suggestions with the Harbour/Moorage committee and see how we might improve our members

ability to launch and store Kayaks. One of the first things I'd like to see is if we might make better use of our existing storage. I suspect there are a number of dinghies that do not get used at all. I'd like to ask all members with dinghies that are never used, to think about whether they need to store them on the docks. If you've not used your dinghy for a couple of years, perhaps you might save yourself a few dollars and roll up that inflatable and store it at home? Just like a 'sleepy boat', a dinghy in storage on our docks should be in use. If it's not, perhaps we could allocate that spot to someone who will use it, and that would include people who are looking to use their kayaks. On that same topic, there has been a proliferation of small boats (mostly kayaks) being hung in sheds and in slips. This action requires the written consent of the Rear Commodore; and the appropriate storage fees need to be assessed. This is a heads up for anyone storing dinghies/kayaks; I will be in contact with those members.

Operations Manager Rusty asked me to remind members that they must provide us a current copy of their vessel insurance. He has a lot of expired policies on file, so please make sure a copy of a current policy is submitted to the office.

Other than that, I don't have a lot to report this month. The weather is still pretty fine; I hope that cruisers and fishers continue to enjoy the water in the coming months.



## PARKING ABUSES AT NYC

As I mentioned in my Logline Report I have been overwhelmed with the complaints by members regarding our parking at NYC. It has been brought to my attention that members are bringing guests/more than one into our parking lot.

Members: – please be aware that you are required to hang a parking tag in your vehicle when parked at NYC. Members are allowed one parking spot per membership. There is a sign at the front gate: Parking is for NYC MEMBERS ONLY!!!!, it is IMPERATIVE you park vehicles in the appropriately marked parking spaces, allowing room for Emergency Vehicles!!!

It is unfortunate that we must go to the next level, but after discussion with the Executive, STARTING IMMEDIATELY we will be enforcing the following:

**IF A MEMBER DOES NOT HAVE A PARKING TAG HANGING IN THEIR VEHICLE THAT IS PARKED AT NYC, YOUR VEHICLE WILL BE TOWED AT THE OWNERS EXPENSE. IF YOU HAVE GUESTS, PLEASE ENSURE THEY ARE NOT PARKING IN THE NYC PARKING LOT.**

MEMBERS YOU CAN HELP – THIS IS YOUR CLUB – IF YOU SEE VEHICLES PARKED WITH NO PARKING TAGS – PLEASE REPORT TO OUR OFFICE STAFF. WE WILL BE DOING RANDOM CHECKS!!!

FACT: FRIDAY, AUGUST 28, 2015 AT 3:30 AFTER CHECKING ALL VEHICLES IN THE PARKING LOT THERE WERE 19 WITH PARKING TAGS AND 42 WITHOUT PARKING TAGS – THIS IS A SERIOUS PROBLEM.
