



Why: It is illegal to use a VHF Radio without a Restricted Operators Certificate (Marine)

Already have an ROC(M): Does the certificate have DSC endorsement? If not, it is illegal to operate a VHF Radio equipped with DSC if you do not have the endorsement.

Treasurer's Report

We are in the midst of the busy season in terms of the Club's financial activities, as we have just completed the Annual Financial Statements, and our officers and committees are currently involved in preparation of the Annual Budget and Five Year Business Plan. In addition, we are working with a number of banks and credit unions on financing the "C Shed" replacement project. We also had an outside audit firm prepare separate financial statements which is a requirement for the "C Shed" funding. Our internal Financial Statements are consistent with those prepared by the audit firm, except ours are more detailed to provide members with more information on the operation of the club.

The Annual Financial Statements for the year ending September 30, 2012 will be presented at the AGM on November 8. The following are highlights of our statements:

- Our cash position decreased to \$310,000 from \$429,000 last year, mainly a result of capital programs. (KJ and EFG docks realignment projects).
- Fixed Assets increased by \$332,000 to \$3.24 million (Gross) and \$1.47 million net of depreciation. Asset replacement cost based on insured values is close to \$6.0 million.
- Revenues (excluding Entrance Fees) increased by \$103,000 resulting from member rate increases October 1, 2011.
- Entrance Fees were flat at \$63,000 versus \$62,000 last year. Entrance Fees are treated as an addition to Member's Equity rather than Revenue.
- Gross Expenses increased to \$658,000 from \$625,000 last year; excluding Depreciation (\$95,000) Cash Expenses were \$562,000, up \$27,000 from last year.
- This year we earned Net Income of \$26,000 versus a loss of \$45,000 last year.
- There was no change in our loan position. The \$25,000 Construction Loan Payable is the 1st and only drawdown to date of the \$275,000 Line of Credit//Construction Loan facility with RBC. This loan provision was renewed in August 2012.

Copies of our internal Financial Statements and the statements prepared by the audit firm are available from the NYC office.

While the Financial Statements are an important part of our management reporting system, they deal with the past, "scorekeeping our performance over the last year". The Annual Budget/Plan is where we look at the future of the Club – where we're going, how we plan to get there, and the financial impacts involved.

Our Annual Budget/Plan meeting is next month – December 13, 2012. At that meeting, we will have a slide presentation detailing our plans for the next five years and request approval of the Budget/Plan by the membership. I urge you all to attend and participate in this meeting.

At this point we generally publish Notice of Motion to approve the budget and plan. However there are other issues connected with "C Shed" funding, the Federal lease, etc. that will require additional Notices, so a separate mailing of Notice of Motion will be sent later this month.

America's Cup 2013 News

Sail-World

There have been developments and incidents aplenty over the past six weeks as the 34th America's Cup takes shape. To date four teams have splashed boats, with Luna Rossa being the latest on Friday evening in Auckland. She is expected to sail mid-week. Artemis Racing is not expected to be too far behind, with the Swedish team suffering another setback when their boat cracked under tow - an operator error. Emirates Team NZ has had a relatively untroubled run, now almost halfway through her allocated 30 days of sailing to January 31, 2013, and is foiling beautifully and steadily on Auckland's Hauraki Gulf.

But it was Oracle Team USA who turned the 34th America's Cup on its ear with a spectacular capsizing on October 16. History will tell if that date marks the end of the beginning or the beginning of the end for the Defender, with just ten months left until the start of the Match. On current projections they will not have a boat sailing for another three months or so, and will not have a two-boat campaign for some time after that. The capsizing happened at probably the worst possible time for them, and the question will be as to how much jump the other teams will have - if any.



Otter Control

It has been brought to my attention that some club members are still using Comet or similar to dissuade the otters from messing up their boats. I agree that otters can be a problem, however depositing any form of cleaner such as Comet around the docks is against the Federal Fisheries act.

Specifically: Section 36(3) states:

"Subject to subsection (4), no person shall deposit or permit the deposit of a deleterious substance of any type in water frequented by fish or in any place under any conditions where the deleterious substance or any other deleterious substance that results from the deposit of the deleterious substance may enter any such water."

Wordy stuff. It goes on to define "deleterious substance", "water frequented by fish" and "deposit" and it is clear that dumping chlorinated cleaners in or around the water constitutes an offense. Fortunately, an alternative is offered. I've been told that using containers filled with mothballs (with some holes punched in the sides so the smell can escape but the moth balls remain dry and in the containers) works well. It might seem like a minor thing, but spray cans using CFCs used to be considered harmless as well. Clean water is the responsibility of all of us. To that end, if you happen to catch someone creating pollution in the ocean, such as a freighter dumping bilge or oil coming down a creek, contact DFO's "**Observe, Record and Report**" line (<http://www.pac.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/fm-gp/rec/points/ORR-ONS-eng.htm>) or the Provincial "**Report All Poachers and Polluters**" line (<http://www.pac.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/fm-gp/rec/points/ORR-ONS-eng.htm>)
