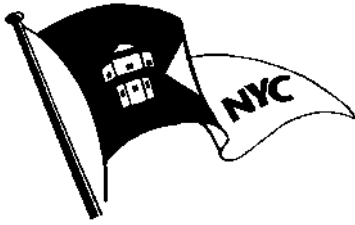

We will be continuing work on the club house exterior and interior painting as well as further work on the soffits and fascia. I would ask all members to keep clear of the work areas to reduce any possible problems.

Parking Issues

This is probably a little of closing the barn door after the horse is out but needs to be stated now and will be repeated as a reminder just before next summer.

During this summer there was an incident where an emergency vehicle had difficulty getting to the clubhouse due to many larger vehicles encroaching into the entry drive lane on the north end of the clubhouse. We must all be more diligent in how we park particularly on that entry lane. No one wants to have to wait extra time in emergency situations. Many of our members and guest are of that age group where one never knows and it could be you waiting. So when parking check to make sure you are not blocking accesses for any traffic, especially if you are going away on your vacation.



Be considerate of your fellow members or guests needs as it could be a life or death situation and waiting is just not acceptable.

You will notice new markings on many of the parking stalls along the entry lane with "small vehicles only" and as well a yellow line indicating the limits of the stall. Please check that your vehicle is not extending into this drive lane when parking. If you do park beyond those markers and are considered a hazard to emergency vehicles you may be towed at your expense.

Also for those driving small vehicles please leave the larger spaces for larger vehicles to further assist in eliminating this problem. For people with larger vehicles please insure that your vehicle is not impeding emergency vehicle access to the area in front of the clubhouse.

Garbage Bin Area

Also if you are parking in the very south end stalls near the garbage containers be sure to leave enough space for the truck to get access to the bins. These are picked up regularly during the summer due in part to the quantity but also to reduce the smell that comes along especially on hot days.

The **Bluenose II** replica of the original Bluenose, has recently spent two years in the shed undergoing a complete rebuild of her hull. Launched on September 29th from her hometown of Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. The restored Bluenose II, with its smaller deckhouse, looks more like the original Bluenose, a fishing schooner built in the 20's with much more deck space.

There is still a significant amount of work to be completed before she sails again in the Spring of 2013; engines, electrical systems and masts and rigging will be fitted over the coming weeks and months.

The original Bluenose was launched as a Grand Banks fishing and racing schooner on 26 March 1921 in Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. With a Mainsail of 4,150 sq. ft. (386 m²) and a total canvas of 11,139 sq.ft. (1036 m) a LOA of 161 ft (49m) and Displ. 285 tons.

From the moment Bluenose went to sea she took home her first Fishermen's Trophy in October of 1921 and the legend began. Over the next 17 years, no challenger — American or Canadian — could wrest the trophy from Bluenose. She earned the title "Queen of the North Atlantic" to become Canada's sailing icon.

2012 Boat Safety Inspections

9:00am to 2:00pm

Saturday/Sunday October 27/28
Saturday/Sunday November 3/4

All vessels moored at NYC must be inspected during the weekends above. Inspectors will be available in the clubhouse committee room during these times.

Vessels must meet the criteria itemized on the safety report to receive the current year safety sticker. Deficiencies found during the inspection must be corrected within two weeks or a \$25 fine will be levied.

To pass the boat safety inspection and to receive a current safety sticker, all boats moored at the Yacht Club must have a valid copy of the boat insurance policy on file in the Yacht Club defining the policy expiry date, and at least \$1 000 000 liability coverage.

It is the owners' responsibility to attend these inspections, and if missed without proper notification a \$50 fine will be levied.

If boat owners cannot be present for inspection during these weekends, please make alternate arrangements for inspection before the inspection weekends.

All vessels must display a valid safety inspection sticker.

Volunteer boat inspectors are greatly appreciated. We guarantee lunch, refreshments, and good company. Sign up sheets for availability will be posted on the bulletin board at the club and you can contact me at 250 754 4981 or cell 250 618 0468.
